Perennial flax produces blue flowers during June and July and grows 12 to 18 inches tall.

Scientific name: *Linum perenne* 'Bright Eyes'

Pronunciation: LYE-num per-REN-nuh

Common name(s): 'Bright Eyes' perennial flax

Family: *Linaceae*

Plant type: herbaceous

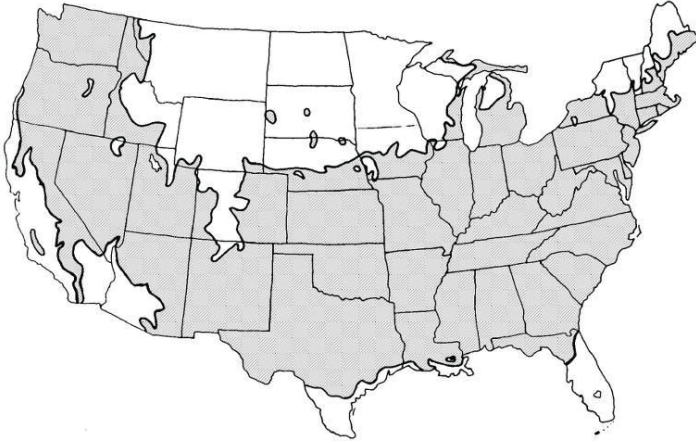


Figure 3. Shaded area represents potential planting range.

USDA hardiness zones: 5 through 8 (Figure 3)

Planting month for zone 7: year round

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Planting month for zone 8: year round

Origin: not native to North America

Invasive potential: may self-seed each year

Uses: edging; mass planting

Availability: somewhat available, may have to go out of the region to find the plant

Height: 1 to 2 feet

Plant habit: upright

Use and Management

Pests and Diseases

Stem rot causes stem rotting. Infected plants have a cottony mold growing on the stem. The disease is caused by *Sclerotinia sclerotianum*.
